EI-Hub Launch Date Rescheduled

The Bureau of Early Intervention announced in April that the EI-Hub launch date has been rescheduled to:

October 15, 2024

This update stems from feedback from EIP stakeholders and the Early Intervention Coordinating Council (EICC), enabling transitioning children to exit the program and providing users with extra time to learn the new system.

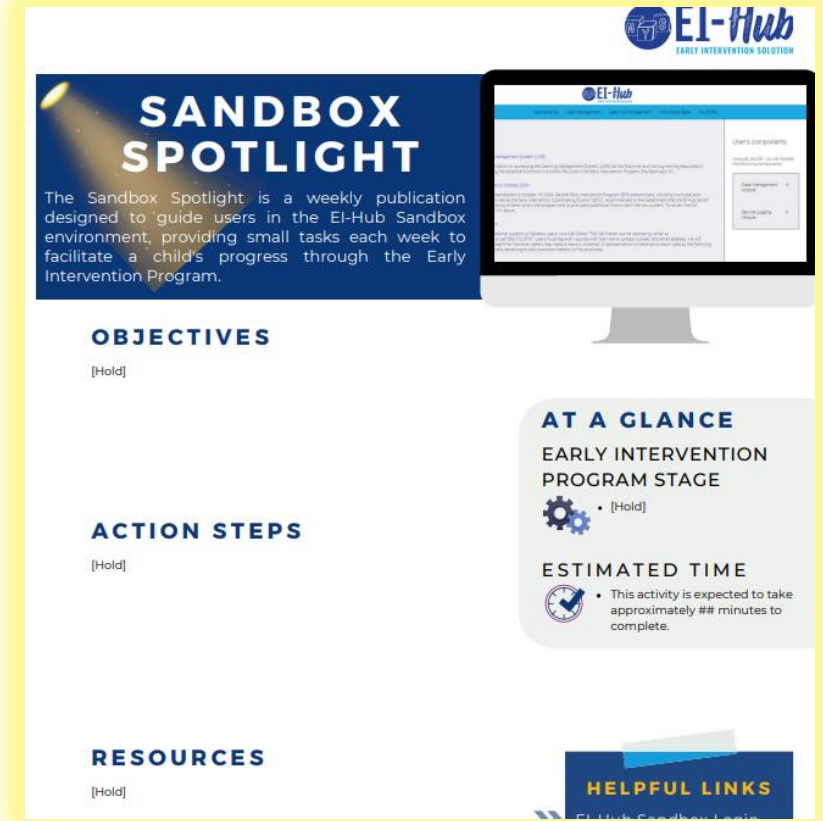


User Role Migration

User role migration plays a vital role in the transition to the EI-Hub. At the launch of the EI-Hub, users will have their current NYEIS role migrated to the corresponding user role in the EI-Hub's Case Management component. This process will not only support the transfer of user accounts but also maintain continuity in users authorized access to their child data.

The EI-Hub offers the added benefit of allowing multiple user roles. This feature provides users with greater flexibility as access can be tailored to accommodate individual needs. Users requiring additional Case Management user roles can request them through their designated Role Administrator. A Role Administrator is the individual(s) with administrative rights who is responsible for setting up and maintaining all the user accounts for their entity. With the transition to the EI-Hub, agencies will now have direct control over their staff's user roles, facilitating more efficient access management.

In addition to establishing access to the Case Management component, Role Administrators also have the responsibility of assigning a user's access to both the new Service Logging and Billing (*currently referred to as EI Billing*) modules within the

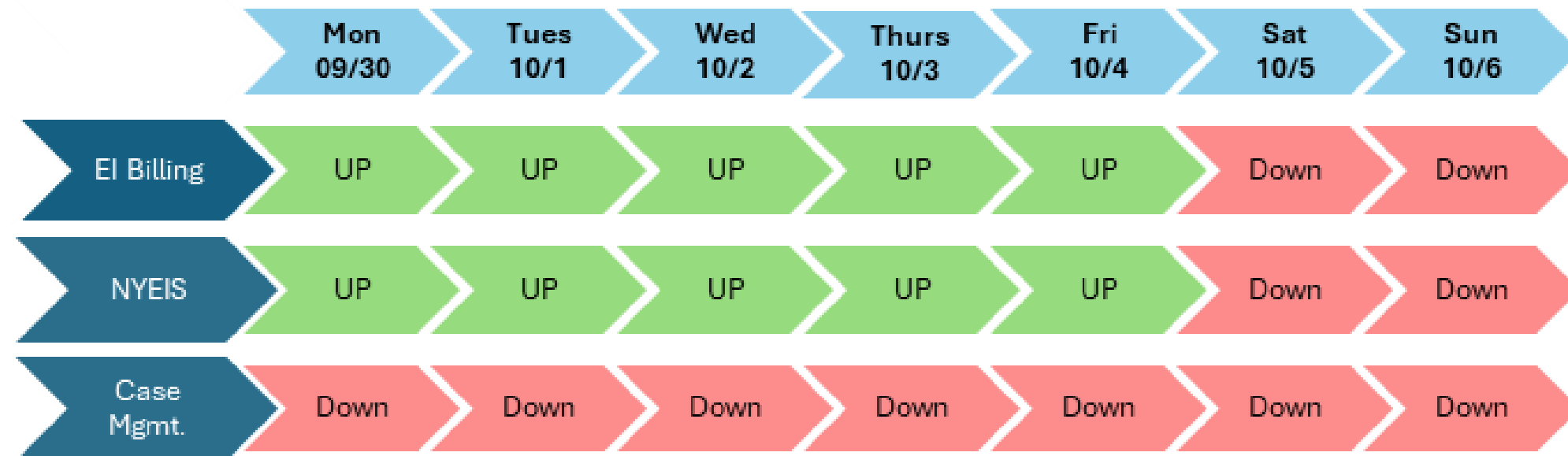

Two Weeks Before EI-Hub Launch

This is the last week to...

- Get new child information or claims into NYEIS.
- Work claims in EI Billing until after Go-Live.
- Providers should be up to date with claiming before NYEIS goes “down” on 10/04/2024.





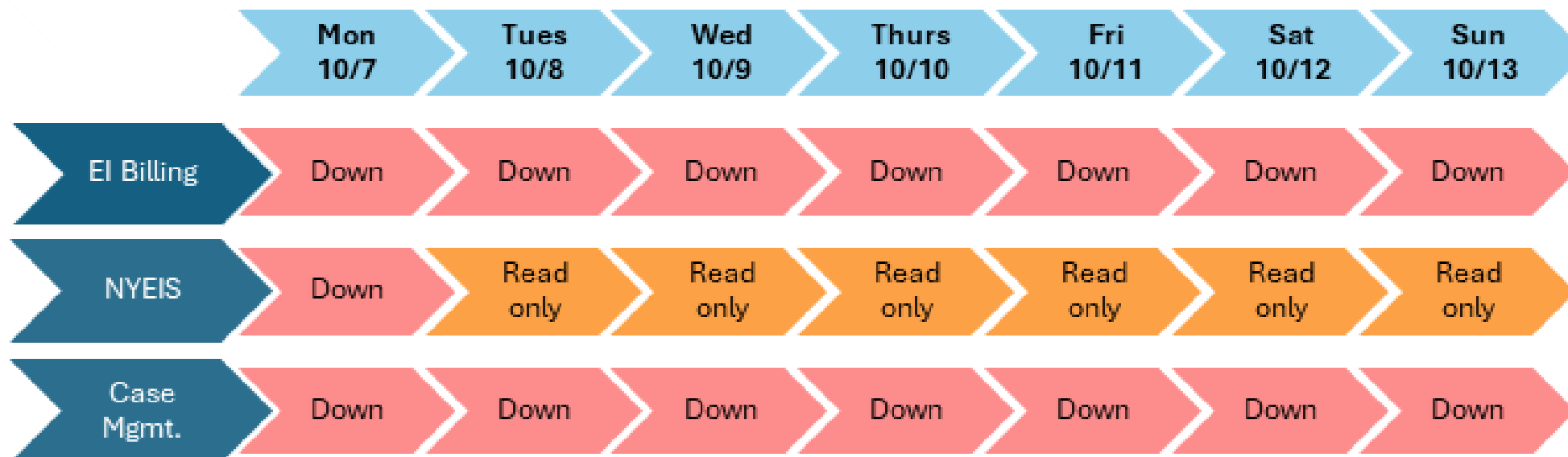

One Week Before EI-Hub Launch

This week...

- NYEIS will go to read only. No more child or claims info can be added.
- EI Billing will create final payments for claims from the last NYEIS File.





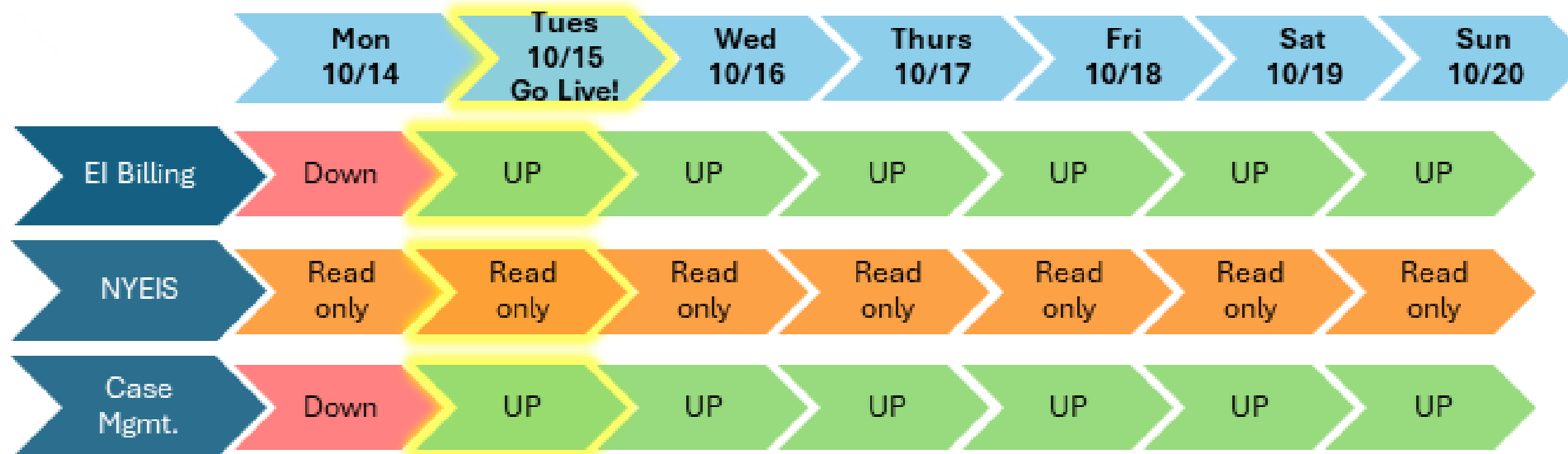

Planned Systems Downtime Schedule

Week of EI-Hub Go-Live

At go-live...

- EI-Hub Case Management and Service Logging will accept child and claims data.
- NYEIS will continue in read only format. No more child or claims info can be added. Attachments can be downloaded from NYEIS.
- EI Billing will allow claims to be worked and send files to Payers on a normal schedule.
